

# Assisting Teachers in Accessing TEKSLinks

- Plan a meeting with one grade level at a time. It works best if each teacher has access to a computer.
- Have a prepared handout for each teacher going through the steps.

- Open Internet Explorer to the Spring Branch ISD homepage
- Open Library Resources
- At the top of that page you will open [Library Information Services Home Page](#)
- Go to #6 Technical Issues
- Open JWALK Home Page and scroll to the bottom
- Choose your grade level TEKSLinks and open
- Remember to copy (Ctrl c) the TEK, click here (will take you to Meriwether), and paste (Ctrl v) the link in the search bar
- You can search your school or the whole district

- Prior to the grade level meeting, I emailed the web address of the appropriate TEKSLink to each team member of the grade level and asked them to bookmark it.
- Example:

- Email the directions to teachers.

- Attend a grade level planning session with your laptop so you can assist in locating materials using the TEKSLinks for the instruction.
- Use the TEKSLinks to pull books to correlate with the TEKS you are teaching that week in your library.

- Continue to send friendly emails to your teachers to remind them about TEKSLinks.
- When you receive a teams 6 week or 9 week roadmap, send them a list of the resources you found in TEKSLinks that supported their teaching.
